

UCF Faculty Member, Students Receive Awards at Annual FLASHA Convention

ORLANDO, June 7, 2010 — Members of UCF's Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders received several awards at the 2010 Annual Convention of the Florida Association of Speech-Language Pathologists and Audiologists, held May 27-30 in Orlando.

Janet Whiteside, director of the UCF Communication Disorders Clinic, was chosen by her peers to receive the Honors of the Association Award.
