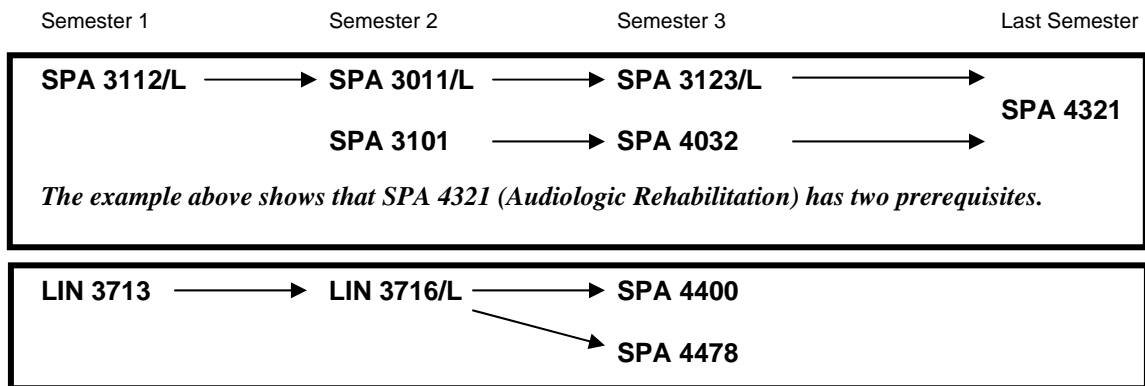

B.A. Degree

Students pursuing the B.A. degree must demonstrate proficiency in a foreign language equivalent to one year of college instruction. Please note:

- Students whose catalog year is **2004-05** or later may use American Sign Language (ASL) to meet the B.A. requirement, but must complete through ASL III (ASL 4161C).
- Students may also meet the B.A. requirement with a passing score on the appropriate examination (i.e. - AP, IB, and CLEP). See the Undergraduate Catalog for details.
- The University Testing Center (Howard Phillips Hall, Room 106, phone 407-823-5109) offers select proficiency examinations by appointment. No credit is earned for a passing score on this type of exam. **At this time, UCF does not have a proficiency exam for ASL.**

Restricted Electives (Must be 3000-level or 4000-level courses)

Students must earn at least 9 credit hours of upper level restricted electives from the list below.

- Any 3000-level or 4000-level course in the Department of Psychology
- Any 3000-level or 4000-level course in the College of Education
- Select 3000-level or 4000-level courses in the Department of Sociology (consult with a Dept. advisor)
- Other course(s) that relate to the major as approved by a Department academic advisor

*Courses used for the B.S. elective requirement cannot also be used for the restricted elective requirement. B.S. seeking students must have a minimum of 15 credit hours of required electives.



Graduation Requirements

Prior to graduating with a bachelor's degree in Communication Sciences and Disorders, all students must:

- Meet all minimum requirements for graduation as specified in the Undergraduate Catalog, or approved by an advisor or the undergraduate coordinator, Dr. Cecyle Carson
- Earn a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher based on all core and elective requirements in the major
- Resolve any incomplete grades or grades below a 'C-' that fulfill core and elective requirements in the major
- Resolve any discrepancies on your Degree Audit with both the department and Undergraduate Student Services.
- File an *Intent to Graduate* form with the College of Health and Public Affairs Office of Undergraduate Student Services. This is completed the semester before you graduate. You will find the intent to graduate on MYUCF.

Please note that if you plan to take courses as a transient student (transfer student), students are not allowed to take a course at another college or university in their last semester. Also, at least 30 of the last 39 semester hours toward a bachelor's degree must be in regular courses at UCF. See the COHPA Office of Undergraduate Student Services (USS) for clarification.

Use the timeline below as a guide:

Requirements	Timeline
Maintain an overall GPA of 2.0 or above	Every semester
May not receive grades below a 'C-' (1.75) in any core or elective courses for the major	Course should be repeated in semester following receipt of unsatisfactory grade
Must earn a minimum of 120 semester hours	By end of final semester
Must earn 60 semester hours after CLEP is awarded	By the end of final semester
Must earn a minimum of 48 semester hours in upper-level courses (3000-level courses or above)	By end of final semester
Must attempt a minimum of 9 semester hours in Summer semester(s) at UCF or other four-year university in Florida	By end of final semester
Must have filed an <i>Intent to Graduate</i> form with COHPA Office of Undergraduate Student Services through MYUCF	Immediately after registration for final semester of classes (no later than the end of the Add/Drop period for the final semester). Once you have filed your intent to graduate online you will then meet with an advisor at USS.

Intent to Graduate

UCF has implemented a new electronic process to file for graduation on-line. Students are required to file an Intent to Graduate form the semester before graduation. Once the student has registered for final classes, and filed online, an appointment is needed at the Undergraduate Student Services (USS) office before the student can be added to the graduation list. It is the student's responsibility to file an *Intent to Graduate* form through MYUCF under student self-service the semester prior to graduation.
