Undergraduate FAQ

1. How do I know if I'm on track to complete my coursework in a timely manner?

Refer to your degree audit, available via My UCF. From there, you can determine which classes you still need to take and can plan accordingly. It's also a good idea to check your degree audit periodically to make sure all information there is accurate.

2. How do I know which classes to take?

Refer to the current required course listing available in the Communication Sciences and Disorders Department. You will find a list of courses and the prerequisites for each. You may also refer to the undergraduate catalog for the recommended course sequence. Advisors are available to help guide you. Once you've created a tentative plan of study for yourself, an advisor can make suggestions if needed.

3. What do I do if I need an override?

Typically, overrides are only given to graduating seniors or those with instructor permission. If you meet either of these criteria, you may visit the department during open advising to obtain an override form. Otherwise, please monitor the course in My UCF should any seats become available.
