ADMINISTRATIVE EXPERIENCE

Undergraduate Coordinator, Department of Criminal Justice and Legal Studies, University of Central Florida, 1999-2005. Assist with all undergraduate matters including advising, curriculum, and scheduling.

Chair, Department of Sociology and Anthropology, University of Central Florida, 1985-1995. The Chair was the principal administrative officer of the Department and responsible for curriculum, scheduling, faculty evaluation, salary increase distribution, budget management, and liaison with the central administration of the University.

Department Head, Sociology Department, Montana State University

1979-1985. The Sociology Department Head was the principal administrative officer for a Department comprised of three academic options which include Sociology, Anthropology and Social and Criminal Justice. The Sociology Department was the responsibility center for over one million dollars in grants and contracts. The Department Head also served as the Department administrative officer to the Agricultural Experiment Station in the College of Agriculture. Department Head responsibilities included supervising and designing curricula, catalog copy, course schedules, and instructional assignments; organizing and implementing faculty searches and interviews; formulating and managing separate budgets; disseminating information and providing opportunities for Department consideration of Department and University issues; generating criteria and procedures consistent with University policy for retention, promotion, and tenure, faculty evaluation; determining salary increases; receiving and resolving student and faculty grievances; promoting and reviewing grant and contract activity; developing policies to govern faculty travel, computer use, and equipment utilization; communicating Department interest to the central administration of the University; and gathering data and information to present to administrative offices, performance of the Department.

Administrative Coordinator, Center for Social Data Analysis,

Montana State University, 1980-81. The Administrative Coordinator of the Center for Social Data Analysis shared with the Director of the Center the responsibilities for personnel decisions; budget, expenditure, and accounting functions; development of Center policy; provision of charge structure for users; operation decisions including data base management, software, and job bids; creation of new grant and contract opportunities; and generation of documentation of Center activity. This position was independent of the Sociology Department Headship.

Director of Social Justice Program, Montana State University,

1972-1976. The Director was responsible for curricular recommendation, recruiting and advising of students, securing internship placements, establishing relationships for state and local criminal justice agencies, and administrative duties.

Acting Chair, Sociology Department, Coe College, 1968-1969. The Chair was responsible for curriculum changes, strengthening the Department's relationship with other College units, increasing the number of majors, and furthering developments consistent with liberal arts education.

Director of Political Workshop, Coe College, 1970. The workshop was designed to provide students an opportunity to participate in a program involving political activity. The responsibilities of the Director included the generation of activities and learning experiences, administration of projects and exercises provided by students, obtaining guest speakers, coordination of student activities in general, and evaluation of the workshop.

Member of Linn County Advisory Board, Linn County, Iowa, 1967-70. The appointment to the Board was to represent the private sector in Linn county to advise the Director of the poverty program. The responsibility included meeting with the Board to recommend policy on such matters as outreach programs, programs for the low income children in public schools, and related matters.

Coordinator for the Urban Studies Program of the Associated Colleges of the Midwest (ACM), 1967-71. The ACM was an association of eleven private, liberal arts colleges and one university. Served on task force which created the Urban Studies Program, member of the selection committee for two years, and program coordinator for Coe College. The program was designed to provide student from ACM schools an opportunity to learn about and experience urban life in America. The site for the program was Chicago, and students went there to live, learn and work about the urban history and conditions.

Coordinator of the College Service Improvement Program, Coe College, 1969-70. The College Service Improvement Program (COSIP) was created and funded by a National Science Foundation Grant to Coe College. The objective of the program was to develop and provide resources for the improvement of instructional skills and abilities. The program involved developing community resources, interdisciplinary courses, innovation teaching techniques, and faculty projects for instruction.
