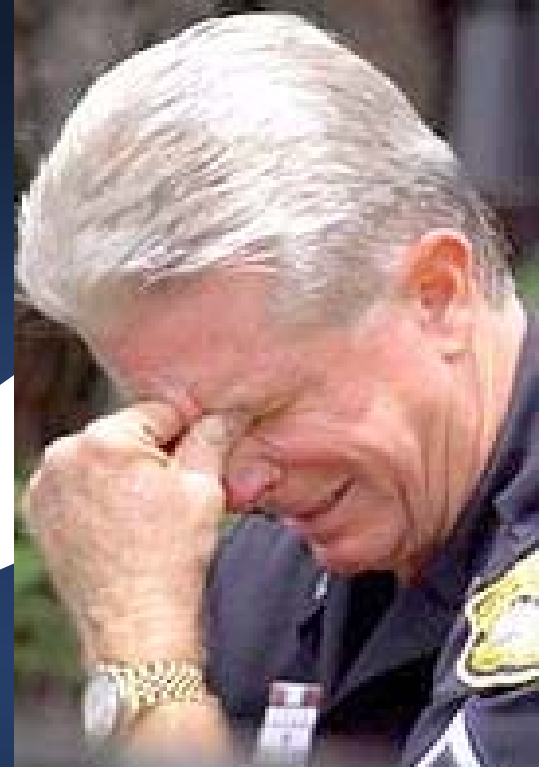




UCF CRIMINAL JUSTICE SEMINAR SERIES

Critical Incident Stress Debriefing

Law enforcement officers and criminal justice professionals are routinely faced with on-the-job incidents that many people would never want to encounter, in addition there are often acute or critical stress incidents that can affect officers deeply. This seminar will address important ways for officers and police agencies to manage stress and critical incidents, and will be led by Mike Steele, a full-time educator and motivational speaker.

Mike Steele is a former law enforcement officer with a Doctorate degree in Counseling, a Master's degree in Psychology and Counseling, and a bachelor's degree in Psychology. While a law enforcement officer, Mike worked in various assignments, including positions with Criminal Investigations, a plain-clothed tactical unit, and with SWAT. Mike also served 4 years in the United States Marine Corps. Mike conducts training courses throughout the state of Florida and internationally on Officer Safety, Leadership and Ethics in Criminal Justice, and Critical Incident Stress Debriefing. Mike has first-hand experience with numerous debriefings resulting from exposure to natural disasters, in the line of duty deaths, and other personal tragedies.

The seminar fee for this course is \$75, CEUs and tuition are extra.
