

## **Clinicals & Cadavers: A Multifaceted Workshop for Physical Therapists**

### **Course Description**

This continuing education course is for physical therapists that support clinical education on at the University of Central Florida. The course will consist of two distinctly different components: a clinical education roundtable, and in-depth review of cadaveric anatomy. Participants will receive a formal presentation on clinical education topics in a formal classroom setting and also participate in discussions among their peers and the clinical education team at UCF. The second part of the course will consist of a musculoskeletal cadaver dissection lab. Attendees will actively participate in the dissections if they choose, with the gross anatomy instructor, the ACCE, and graduate students all serving as proctors.

### **Course Objectives**

#### **Clinical Education Component**

Upon completion of the course, attendees will be able to:

1. Understand the policies & procedures off clinical education at the University of Central Florida
2. Design appropriate learning experiences to foster thee clinical education of DPT students.
3. Properly rate student performance and provide structured feedback to positively influence student professional growth.
4. Recognize situations or student actions that warrant development of remedial action, communication with clinical education team at UCF, and those that warrant dismissal from clinical affiliation.

#### **Anatomical Component**

Upon completion of the course, attendees will be able to:

1. Identify anatomic features in cadavers that correspond with the individual's practice interests.
2. Understand the anatomic considerations of common n injuries, pathologies, and surgeries.
3. Understand the impact of that anatomic features have on common rehabilitation principles.

Dr. Smith has been funded numerous times by NIH for his research in topics of neuroplasticity and aerobic exercise in stroke patients. Dr. Smith teaches gross anatomy, neuroanatomy, neuro rehabilitation, and cardiopulmonary rehabilitation at UCF.

She received her undergraduate degree in Literature from Queens University in Charlotte and her Master's degree in Education with focus on Higher Education / Administration from Wright State University.
