Alumni Chapter Establishes Scholarship for Health Services Administration Graduate Students

Recognizing the value of an advanced degree in careers in health-care administration, the Health Services Administration Alumni Chapter has established a scholarship for master's degree students in health services administration. The chapter hopes to award the first scholarship in 2010.

Like many health-care professions, health services administration requires a high level of knowledge and skill to assume the responsibilities of the profession, which can include managing large budgets and large numbers of employees. Many consider a graduate degree in the field to be essential for career advancement.

The HSA Alumni Chapter Scholarship fund was created with contributions from officers and members of the chapter and faculty members from the program. "Scholarships assist students who otherwise might not be able to attend college or graduate school," said Aaron Liberman, chair of the new Department of Health Management and Informatics. "This scholarship will serve as a source of encouragement for students in the health services administration program, many of whom are the first in their family to attend college."

News from the Department

With the newly minted health management and informatics program now firmly established and on the way as a free standing department, there are several newsworthy items that our alumni may be interested in.

We are proposing a healthcare informatics master's degree which, if approved by the UCF governing board, will become a reality in May 2009. This will be an online program that will be available locally as well as out of state to prospective students. Students will be expected to come to campus once each semester to complete the respective courses that are taken.

We also have a number of pending opportunities on the international scene. Our faculty is most fortunate to have Dr. Bernardo Ramirez, who is both a physician and an M.B.A. graduate. Over the past 25 years, Dr. Ramirez has become an internationally recognized authority and expert in HSA educational programming. His experiences in developing learning programs throughout eastern and western Europe, as well as in South and Central America, have made him a logical go-to person to head up our new programs and initiatives for developing countries. Dr. Ramirez has been named director of Global Health Initiatives and there will be much more to report on this front during the coming months.

We are also most fortunate to have been able to recruit one of our own graduates, Dr. Reid Oetjen, as an incoming assistant professor. Among other activities, he will focus on long term programs. Dr. Oetjen completed the Doctoral Program in Public Affairs at UCF and for the past four years has been an assistant professor at the University of North Florida in Jacksonville. Dr. Timothy Rotarius, a long-standing faculty member and professor in the new Department of Health Management and Informatics, has been named vice chair of the department.

Alumni associates, I would like to again thank you for your involvement and for the energy you have shown in developing the HSA Alumni Chapter as an integral part of the HSA programs at UCF. We truly cannot be successful without your continued and active involvement in all aspects of our program and department development.
