**CURRICULUM & PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT:**

*Public Affairs Ph.D. Curriculum Revision* (committee member): Developed competencies for the doctoral students, core values, ethical principles, core courses and competency matrix, and developed the theoretical foundation of public affairs course.

*Master of Public Administration (MPA) and Public Affairs Ph.D. degree programs*: Designed and facilitated the dual degree program (with Dr. Lawther)

Students in the dual degree program will engage research with the department faculty over several years. Faculty can mentor/develop students more fully with this long term interaction. The total student credit hours (SCHs) for the dual degree would be eighty-one (81) hours. There would be six (6) hours waived by the MPA Program and twelve (12) student credit hours counted in both programs (cross-crediting) reducing the overall total from 99 SCHs to 81 SCHs. Students successfully completing the MPA /PhD dual degree program will receive two diplomas, one for the MPA degree and one for the PhD degree.

*Track in Public Administration, Doctoral Program in Public Affairs*: Designed and coordinated the Public Administration in the Doctoral Program in Public Administration

The Public Administration Track integrates the historical evolution of the public administration field, the current challenges in theory and practice in our increasingly inter-connected society, and the future directions needed as a discipline and society to achieve responsive solutions to complex public problems. The track will assist our students in developing competencies in knowledge / theory and research skills in the field of public administration.

*Graduate Emergency Management and Homeland Security Certificate*: Designed an Interdisciplinary Graduate Certificate Program in Emergency Management and Homeland Security and developed curricula.

The certificate provides a professional credential for emergency managers preparing to apply for the Certified Emergency Manager (CEM) program; emergency responders and public health personnel needing to know how their professions fit into the national, state, and local emergency management systems; administrators in educational, business, and other settings where a knowledge of emergency management policies and programs may be needed; and students preparing for academic careers teaching emergency management and homeland security or related courses. The certificate program courses integrates/uses Emergency Management Institute EMI (of FEMA/DHS) resources available online.

*Minor in Emergency Management and Homeland Security*: Revised the curriculum for the Emergency Management minor at the Department of Public Administration in UCF.

The proposed changes are to reflect the role of emergency management in homeland security. The name has been changed from Emergency Management to Emergency Management and Homeland Security.
