A one-year follow-up will be conducted using offender and victim self-reports in addition to official reports of recidivism. Two current theories of crime causation, Social Control and General Theory of Crime, will be tested for their appropriateness in explaining domestic violence. - **“Pregnant Adolescents and Their Children’s Health (PATCH).”** Based out of the Bronx-Lebanon Hospital Center, the study will recruit 400 adolescent first-time mothers-to-be (ages 14-20). These women will be randomly assigned into either the experimental or control conditions. The control condition is prenatal and perinatal care as usually received. Alternately, the experimental intervention provides two evidence-based programs including Centering Pregnancy (CP) and Parent-Child Interaction Therapy (PCIT). CP seeks to achieve healthy pregnancy and birthing outcomes by teaching women proper prenatal care through the child’s birth. Once the newborn arrives, the new mothers will then begin PCIT. This intervention seeks to promote positive attachment between mother and her baby and then builds on this to provide proper parenting skills until the child is 2 years of age. As such, this partnering of programs provides a full range of prenatal and perinatal training which is aimed at aiding these poor, young, inner city adolescents successfully adapt in their new roles as mothers and, in this manner, provide a strong foundation for their child’s healthy development. A variety of measures will be collected to more fully study the impact that this preventive intervention has on both mother and child. These measures include psychological, sociological, and, importantly, biological factors with the latter being collected to measure epigenetic effects. - **“Multnomah Maternity Model (3M).”** This study idea will focus on high-risk first-time mothers-to-be in no more than their second trimester of pregnancy through their child’s second birthday. The grant will attempt to develop, implement, and experimentally test the ability to deliver prenatal and perinatal services in a group setting (with selective home visits) led by a nurse and community health worker team. Given that it is group-based and does not rely on community nurses exclusively to provide services, if found effective it would prove more affordable than current nurse home visiting programs. (Lynette Feder and Jacquelyn Campbell, co-PIs.)

- **“Women, Trauma and its Long-Term Effects on Parenting.”** As with the NFP+ Study, this will look to work with high-risk young first-time mothers-to-be by melding an evidence-based intervention that has been found to be effective in reducing trauma, Eye Movement Desensitization Reprocessing (EMDR), into the NFP curriculum. Research indicates that these young women have been victims of multiple traumas. Trauma, in turn, has been consistently found to negatively impact parenting ability. Therefore, women entering NFP will randomly be assigned to either control (NFP as usual) or experimental (NFP plus EMDR) and then they and their child will be followed until the child is two years of age. (Lynette Feder and Jacquelyn Campbell, co-PIs.)

- **“Multnomah Community Youth Violence Prevention Project.”** The submission seeks to develop, implement and evaluate (using an experimental design) a youth violence prevention program seeking to build social capital within high risk neighborhoods so as to impact upon a community’s collective efficacy. The study involves a community partnership with Multnomah County Department of School and Community Partnerships and Multnomah County Health Department. Grant application was originally picked for funding but then funding retracted due to budget cuts. We have been strongly encouraged, though, to resubmit. (Lynette Feder, Principal Investigator & Robert Sampson, Co-Investigator.)
