Admission to the FSU College of Law J.D. program is highly competitive. Students participating in the 3+3 program generally will be required to:

- Take the LSAT during or before their junior year and earn a score acceptable for admission.
- Successfully complete at least 15 credit hours of UCF course work with a 3.2 UCF GPA at time of application.
- Earn at least 90 undergraduate credits prior to matriculation at the law school. Participants must successfully complete a minimum of 30 credit hours in residence at UCF.
- Fulfill all major and graduation requirements (except the 120 credit hours) by the end of their junior year.
- Fulfill any other requirements separately imposed by the student's undergraduate college.
- Apply for admission to the law school during or by the end of their junior year and by the FSU College of Law application deadline.
- Pay the full-time law school tuition/fees rate (financial aid available).

FSU LAW WILL NOTIFY APPLICANTS OF ADMISSIONS DECISIONS BY **JUNE 1**.

OVERVIEW – 3+3 Eligibility and Admissions

- A 3+3 program does not guarantee admission into law school.
- No more than 30 credit hours can be transferred from a 3+3 law school toward the 120 credit hours needed to complete a bachelor's degree at UCF.
- A bachelor's degree at UCF is not completed until the successful completion of the first year at a 3+3 law school.
- Both the Department of Legal Studies and Office of Pre-Health and Pre-Law Advising at UCF have the discretion of accepting or denying admission to a student to a 3+3 accelerated law program.

The University of Central Florida has established 3+3 Accelerated Law Programs with

- **Touro College Law Center** (Central Islip, NY)
- **Barry University School of Law** (Orlando, FL)
- **Florida State University College of Law** (Tallahassee, FL)

Students who meet the eligibility and admission requirements at *both* UCF and one of these three law schools can complete a bachelor's degree and a law degree in **six** years rather than the traditional seven, saving a year of time and costs.

ELIGIBILITY

- Full-time student (12 or more credit hours per semester)
- Declared major in legal studies
- Competitive SAT/ACT scores
- Completion of a minimum of one semester in residence at UCF
- Completion of a minimum of 15 credit hours with a GPA of at least 3.0
- Cumulative GPA of at least a 3.3

APPLICATION TO PROGRAM

⇒ In freshman or sophomore year

- Submit to UCF's Department of Legal Studies:
 - Personal statement explaining interest in program (maximum of 500 words)
 - Letter of recommendation from a faculty member in the Department of Legal Studies
- Prepare for a personal interview (to be scheduled)

ADMISSION TO TOURO LAW

⇒ At beginning of junior year

- Take Law School Admission Test (LSAT) prior to applying for admission and achieve a minimum score of 149
- Apply for admission to Touro Law by February 1
- Submit letter to Touro Law from UCF's legal studies' advisor certifying successful progress toward completion of all UCF program requirements
- Meet Touro Law's requirements for moral fitness and character

⇒ By end of junior year

- Complete a minimum of 93 credit hours at UCF, consisting of all GEP and major in legal studies' requirements

UCF+ **Barry University Dwayne O. Andreas School of Law** *Orlando, Florida*

ELIGIBILITY

- Full-time student (12 or more credit hours per semester)
- Declared major in legal studies
- Competitive SAT/ACT scores
- Completion of a minimum of one semester in residence at UCF
- Completion of a minimum of 15 credit hours at UCF with a GPA of at least 3.0
- Cumulative GPA of at least 3.3

Transfer Students at UCF

UCF+ **Touro Law or Barry Law**

ELIGIBILITY

- Full-time student (12 or more credit hours per semester)
- Declared major in legal studies
- Completion of a minimum of one semester in residence at UCF
- Meeting with legal studies' advisor to map out course work
- Completion of all PLA courses with at least a 3.0 GPA
- Cumulative GPA of at least a 3.3
- Application to 3+3 program by second semester

APPLICATION TO PROGRAM

⇒ By second semester at UCF

- Submit to UCF's Department of Legal Studies:
 - Personal statement explaining interest in program (maximum of 500 words)
 - Letter of recommendation from a faculty member in the Department of Legal Studies
- Prepare for a personal interview (to be scheduled)

ADMISSION TO BARRY LAW OR TOURO LAW

⇒ Junior year

- Take Law School Admission Test (LSAT) prior to applying for admission and achieve a minimum score of 149
- Apply for admission to Barry Law or Touro Law by February 1
- Submit letter to Barry Law or Touro Law from UCF's legal studies' advisor certifying successful progress toward completion of all UCF program requirements

⇒ By end of junior year

- Complete at least 102 credit hours toward bachelor's degree, consisting of associate's degree credit hours and 42 hours of PLA core and elective courses in legal studies' major
